Graduating Class of 2012 to 2020 and Post-secondary Enrollment of 2013 to 2021









#### **Definitions**

- •Capture Rate: percentage of students in the high school graduating class that enroll in a post-secondary institution in the year following their high school graduation.
- •**Graduation Cohort:** high school graduates with a graduation date between August 16th of a particular calendar year through August 15th of the following calendar year.
- •Post-secondary Enrollment Period: period defined for determination of whether graduation cohort members enrolled in a post-secondary institution; from May 1st of a particular calendar year through April 30th of the following calendar year.
- •There is a One Year Lag between the Graduation Cohort and the Enrollment Period: For example; when looking at enrollment for 2020-21 Grad Cohort, we are looking at how many of those HS grads enrolled in 2021-22

## SWC One-Year Capture Rate of SUHSD Graduating Class 31.3% for graduating class 2020-21 Grew from 2012-2015 and declined in 2019 The Overall Capture Rate increased in 2020-21




# Capture Rates for Most Institutions Declined or Were Flat from 2012-2020 Other than SWC, USCD, and SDSU Percent of students with no subsequent year enrollment decreased in 2020 but are higher than 2015-2018




# SWC Capture Rates Appear Inversely Related to the rate of SUHSD Graduates Not Enrolling in College




### 2020-21 Overall Capture Rates of SUHSD Graduates by Gender and Race/ Ethnicity

Hispanics have one of the lowest capture rates and are the largest group. The graduating cohort is 5,644 individuals and over 4,000 are Hispanic.



# Males and Hispanic High School Students were not captured at the same rate as Females or other races/ ethnicities




# Asian, Black/ African American, & Hispanic Male High School Students were not captured at the same rate as Females of the same Ethnicity




### Where can Southwestern engage more students?

■ Southwestern ■ No Subsequent Year Enrollment




### **Are More Students Enrolling at Southwestern?**




### **Are More Students Enrolling in Post-Secondary Education?**

### **Key Takeaways**

- SWC Capture Rate of SUHSD Graduating Class reached 35% in 2018, more than doubling since 2012
- SWC Capture Rate decreased in the most recent year from 35% in 2018-19 to 31.3% in 2020-21
- Percent of SUHSD Graduating Class not enrolling in college decreased in 2020 but still about 30% of HS graduates don't go to any college one year following graduation SWC opportunity
- Target specific high schools (e.g., Sweetwater High School) that have a larger volume of students but lower capture rates
- Capture rates disproportionately lower for Males and Hispanic high school students- SWC opportunity for targeted recruitment
