



Window Snapping

This Windows feature allows you to move your active application window around a single, or multi-monitor, desktop environment.

The feature can be activated by the following keyboard shortcuts:

Win + ↓ (Windows key and down arrow key)	Win + → (Windows key and right arrow key)
<p>This shortcut will restore down a maximized window on the first instance. On a subsequent instance, it will minimize the window to the taskbar.</p>	<p>This shortcut will snap a window to the right side of the screen. On a multi-monitor environment, it will start with the right side of the active monitor, but it will traverse across to other monitor's left half on a second instance, then on a third, it will go into a restored window, and upon a fourth instance it will reach the right half side of the monitor and continue if additional monitors are present.</p>
	
Win + ↑ (Windows key and up arrow key)	Win + ← (Windows key and left arrow key)
<p>This shortcut can only maximize a restored down a window.</p>	<p>This shortcut will snap a window to the left side of the screen and it behaves similarly to the Win + → (Windows key and right arrow key) keyboard shortcut.</p>
