Student Body

SWC's student body of more than 19,000 spans all age groups, nationalities, and educational backgrounds. Ethnic students comprise 83 percent of all enrollments; the average age is 27.

Educational Costs

Full-time students, who are California residents, pay about \$200 per semester for tuition and fees. There are a number of Financial Aid programs available to help pay for enrollment, books, transportation and other costs. Application Process

If you are 18 years or older, or a high school graduate, you can enroll at Southwestern College. Just fill out an application at the Southwestern College Admissions Center, Education Center at San Ysidro, or Higher Education Center at National City.
