### Governing Board Request

During the Governing Board Facilities Workshop held on June 27, 2017, Trustees identified several goals that they felt were important priorities that should be included in a Facilities Master Plan (FMP) update. The Governing Board asked that the draft priorities they identified be taken to the regular Governing Board meeting on July 11, 2017 so that it could be reviewed and finalized by the entire Governing Board. Once finalized, they will be added to the list of priorities identified through the college facilities survey.

### Draft Governing Board Priorities

- Provide for the safety and security of students, faculty, and staff
- Construct and modernize facilities to meet student support services needs
- Foster innovation / consider new educational facility models (think outside the box)
- Provide the appropriate tools to support and deliver 21st Century Instruction
- Ensure that all facilities are planned to be inclusive of technology
- Improve the student experience, keep student needs front and center in all decisions
- Plan, design and construct instructional facilities that best serve students educational needs
- Improve parking and address transportation needs
- Develop guidelines that provide for an inclusive FMP update process
- Provide opportunities for District-wide dialog by holding forums at the higher education centers as well as the main campus
- Provide opportunities for community dialog and input by holding community forums at off campus locations (similar to what was done during the bond campaign)
- Add the higher education centers to the list of consultation groups
- Provide options and communicate recommendations to the Governing Board for review discussion and approval
- During the FMP analysis process, make sure all groups that are to be represented are present at meetings
- Analyze center issues and get community input:

- Security
- Food options
- Student spaces
