## COMMUNICABLE DISEASES

Reference: Education Code Section 76403; California Code of Regulations Title 17; California Department of Health Services; Center for Disease Control (CDC); County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency:

The College District shall not discriminate against any person with a communicable disease as defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act, and California Government Code Section1292i6.1(c) except as required by Federal or State Law for Public Safety.

The Superintendent/President shall establish procedures necessary to assure cooperation with local public health officials in measures necessary for the prevention and control of communicable diseases in students. Such procedures shall comply with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act, and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act.

The following are the minimum standards required by law:

- Cooperation with local health officers in measures necessary for the prevention and control of communicable diseases in students;
- Compliance with any immunization program required by State Department of Health Services regulations; and
- Compliance with all academic program and transfer student immunization requirements.

## Health Services will provide:

- Tuberculosis (TB) testing, Hepatitis B vaccination, Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis vaccinations, and influenza vaccinations;
- Community resources for meningitis vaccination, Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccination, varicella vaccination, pneumonia vaccination, and travel vaccinations;
- It shall be the duty of every health care provider to report to the County of SD HHSA any case or suspected case of any reportable diseases or conditions. Physician/Nurse must complete a form according to the disease or condition identified as a reportable communicable disease; and
- Health Services shall cooperate with local public health officials from the County of SD HHSA in measures necessary for the prevention and control of an identified communicable disease.
