 - Dr. Nish reported on behalf of Nora Vargas as follows:
 - The Governing Board passed a board resolution in opposition to unitary water rates. SWC has made great efforts to save water by installing artificial turf and using recycled water for irrigation as well as installing a "smart" irrigation system. New buildings will have a collection system for water run off.
 - Hiring is in full swing. An early incentive option is available to employees and approximately 50 employees are expected to retire/separate from SWC before December 31, 2015.
 - Focusing on students' first year experience and preparing them for college by encouraging high school students to take math during their senior year and by providing "boot camps" during the summer. Once students start at SWC designated counselors, peer mentors, and embedded classroom tutors are provided.
