

- ♦ Step 2: In the student tab, look under "User Account"

Additional Degree and Certificate Information:

- ♦ You can earn Certificates and Degrees at the same time.
- ▶ Double Major You can complete a second A.S. degree with the completion of about 18 additional units.
- ♦ Certificates and Degrees are not automatically given to you when you have completed your required classes.
- ♦ You must submit the required paperwork to request them from the Admissions and Records office.

More About Catalog Rights...

Additional Degree and Certificate Information:

- Catalog rights means that if your degree or certificate requirements change while you are attending school, you are eligible to complete it with the original requirements.
- ♦ You have "Catalog Rights" for the year that you started the program You must be a continuous student, and may not miss more than 1 semester (Fall or Spring) or your catalog rights start from when you return.
- There is an exception if you miss more than one semester because you are in the military.
- ♦ Keep your catalog from the year you started!

Associates of Science Degrees

- ♦ Have a "grad check" performed by the Advising Center.
- Completely fill out a Graduation Petition form and submit it by the deadline for the semester in which you plan to graduate.
- If you are seeking to substitute a course completed at another school or one course for another, you need to petition for a variance with the appropriate department/division. Do this well in advance of your planned graduation date!
- ♦ All transcripts from other colleges or universities must be either included with the petition or on file in the Admissions Office.
- Submit or mail the petition to the Admissions Office.

Course Offering Frequency

- ♦ SWC has a new commitment to students to offer all degree classes within a two year cycle.
- ♦ Some LNT/LA Classes are offered every semester, some once per year, and some once per every 2 years. Plan carefully, ask teachers when they may be offered or go the LNT webpage to see when future classes will be offered.
- Some classes have a prerequisite (Landscape Design 2) or require a teacher waiver to enroll.
- Don't wait to enroll in classes, you may find it is cancelled before it starts.

Student Work Experience

- ♦ Students may apply to work for the LNT department as a paid student worker in late August of every school year. They must carry at least 6 units (3 of which must be an LNT or LA class)
- ◆ Students may also work as a non-paid student worker by signing up for the PD 290 Occupational Cooperative Education class. By working for us, you earn up to 4 units of college credit and satisfy the work experience requirement needed for many of our degrees and certificates. Students may also use a currently held horticulture job with an employer to meet this requirement.

Student Scholarships

- Many scholarships are offered solely to LNT or LA students.
- ♦ Apply by going to the college's scholarship website. From the home page, click on Student Services and then click on Scholarships and begin the process. You can apply for horticultural scholarships and other campus-wide scholarships.
- ▶ These awards are valued from \$50 to as much as \$1,000.
- Remember, you can't win if you don't apply!
- ♦ The application process begins February 1st don't delay!
