College District Policy and Procedure No. 2515 provide for the College District to rely primarily upon the Academic Senate to develop Distance Education (DE) that complies with federal and state law, Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) accreditation standards, and Title 5 for curriculum development and mode of instructional delivery.

Distance Education is defined as instruction in which the instructor and student are separated by distance and interact within the College District's course management system. All Distance Education is subject to the general requirements of Title 5 section 55200 et seq. In addition, instruction provided as Distance Education is subject to the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. §12100 et seq.) and Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. §794d).
