John Brown indicated that they do extensive research and do not anticipate hazardous materials in DeVore Stadium, but if they do encounter hazard materials, they will suspend work and enter into emergency contract for services. He added that there are testing companies under contract at this time, such as California Soils and Testing and it is in their scope for testing or they could sub contract.

Nader offered to amend the negative declaration to indicate in response to the input from the Department of Toxic Substance Control, that should we unexpectedly encounter any suspected toxic substances, through our contract with California Soils and Testing, they would have appropriate testing done and determine the appropriate agency to contact for any necessary radiation. John Brown requested to not name the consultant in particular, which was accepted by Nader and the maker of the motion, Aguilar, and seconder, Roesch.

Hernandez asked for clarification of the motion, specifically inquired if the proposed wording would be added to the resolution.
