The cards have been modified slightly to make this clear.

This policy and practice ensures that the Board has an opportunity to hear from the public and interested parties prior to making a decision on an item on the agenda. As with all boards, we endeavor to make sound, well-thought, fully analyzed and deliberated decisions.

The reports section of the agenda is designed to provide administration and key stockholders an opportunity to present a report of their activities to the Board of Trustees. This is not the time to engage in debate, deliberations, collective bargaining or reflecting on agenda items. This time is intended for Bboard members to receive information and become familiar with the activities and events going on at the college.

We sincerely appreciate everyone's cooperation in helping us keep these meetings as smooth as possible. We also greatly appreciate those individuals, whether college employees or members of the community, for stepping up and providing us with input to help us make sound, well-informed decisions for the college.
