  - For employees hired after July 14, 2005, effective July 14, 2005, the maximum District • contribution for medical benefits will be no greater than the highest HMO selection based on their dependent status (employee, employee and one, employee and two). The employee must pay the difference.
- Β. The maximum District contribution to the health & welfare benefit package for any employee hired before January 1, 2002, who opts out of the District's health & welfare benefits plan will cap at five thousand two hundred dollars (\$5,200) per year.
