### **Textbook Policies**

#### **Textbook Selection**

All composition courses require a textbook from the approved list. Below are the department's textbook policies and recommended texts for English 71, 114, 115, 116, and 220. (Prices reflect **new**/used bookstore prices of the most recent edition.) Under no circumstances may a text approved for one course be used in another.

### **Supplemental and Replacement Textbooks**

An instructor choosing to use an entire textbook (not individual readings or novels) as a supplement to the required books or to replace a required book must complete a "Single Semester Textbook Approval" form to provide the department with a rationale for use. This request must be submitted to the ENGL Department Textbook Committee for review in a timely manner, *no later than six weeks prior to the beginning of a semester*. #### **Piloting New Textbooks**

Instructors wishing to add a title to the ENGL Department Approved Textbook List shall submit the book for review under the guidelines of the ENGL Department Textbook Pilot Program. Single semester approval for use of a book that does not appear on the Approved Textbook list does not guarantee approval in the future.

#### **Instructor Published Packets**

An instructor may request to replace a required book with a packet of readings and texts he/she has compiled that is appropriate for the course. This request must be made in writing. All materials must be provided to the ENGL Department Textbook Committee for review in a timely manner, *no later than six weeks prior to the beginning of a semester*. Any instructor-published material is subject to copyright laws, department policies regarding textbooks, and the Southwestern College Academic Senate Policy on Adoption and Use of Instructional Materials.

#### **Textbook Costs**

As textbook prices have become increasingly prohibitive for many of our students, we must do our best to keep costs down. For example, using a previous edition when ample copies are available (and the bookstore can determine this) may reduce costs for students. online retailers: Understandably, many students are choosing to purchase their textbooks online at lower prices. Please make them aware that free shipping will substantially delay their order, and expedited shipping may wipe out any cost savings.

Some of our popular texts now cost over \$100 new. These texts should be able to stand on their own without the need for supplementation and additional cost. When ordering multiple selections for one course, please ensure that the total does not exceed \$100.
