

USE OF DISTRICT LAND

The Governing Board has a right and a duty to preserve and protect the land of the district for the use of present and future generations.

The fundamental purpose of the land acquired by the district is to provide adequate land for the facilities and space needed for the district's instructional, educational, recreational, athletic and research activities.

While financial, political, aesthetic and environmental considerations need to be considered, the dominant and prevailing consideration must be the appropriateness of the use of district land in furthering the district's mission.

The use of lands shall be planned in a manner consistent with the characteristics of the district as an instructional and educational enterprise. The board shall provide flexibility in its plans to meet unanticipated changes in needs.

Uses of district lands shall foster an institution of which all people who have the welfare of the district at heart can be proud. The development of the district shall serve in an important way as a model for academic planning and development. Cooperation with adjoining communities is important, and the concerns of neighboring jurisdictions shall be considered in the planning process.
