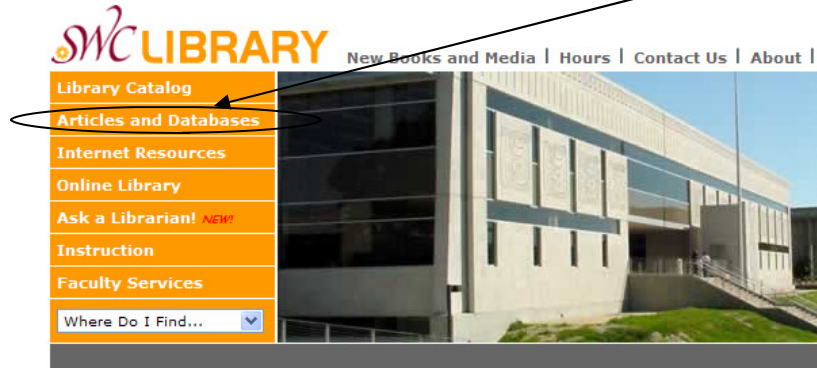




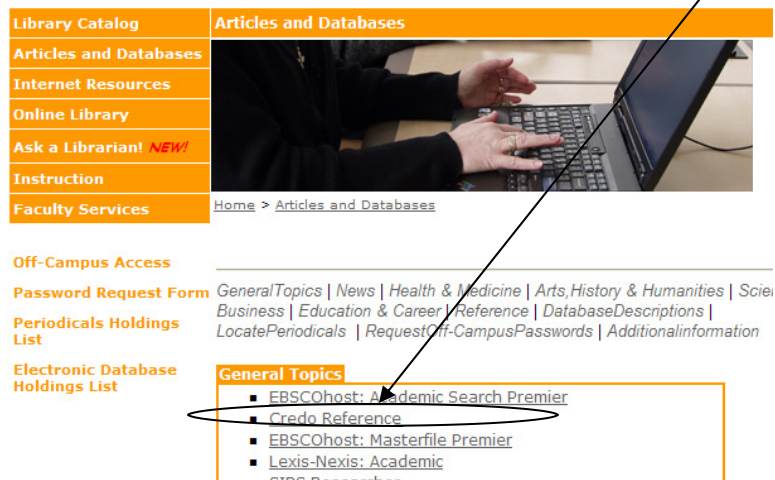

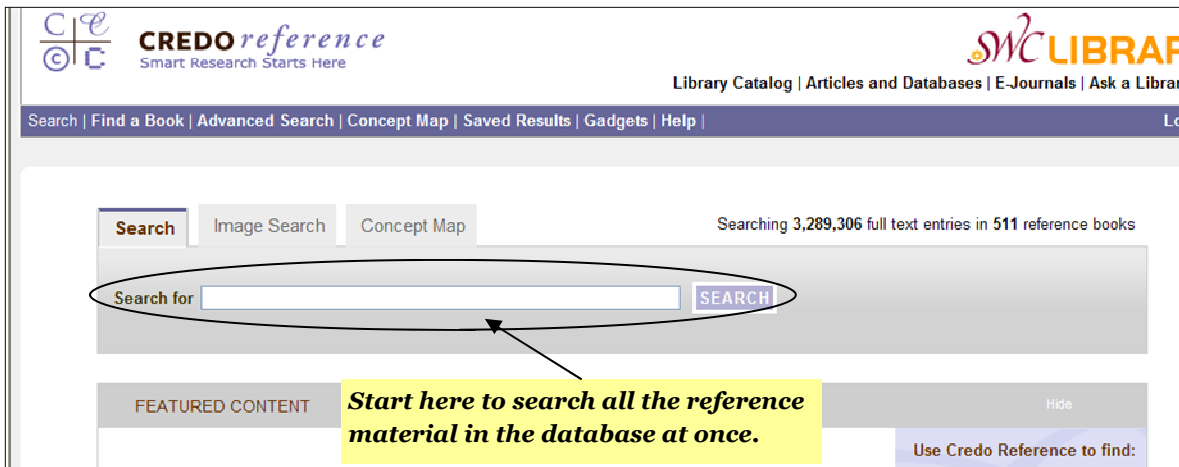
Step 1: From the Library's homepage (www.swccd.edu/~library) click on the **Articles and Databases** tab.

Despite the existence of ten previous resolutions, Iraq should be offered one the return o military act principle, b unacceptable, since it would open a Pandora's box in international law. The sole legitimate objective was to destroy any existing WMD. Finally, France believed there had been no significant contact between the Iraqi regime and Al Qaeda.
