 - Assessment(s) meeting authentication/privacy guidelines and incorporating instructor feedback

Final Review

- Completed deliverables will be reviewed by peers and the DEFT facilitation team using the DEFT Rubric.
 - If the final review finds that minor revisions are needed, the candidate will be given an opportunity to resubmit.
 - o If major revisions are needed to reach rubric alignment, the candidate can re-enroll in DEFT to continue developing the course with additional feedback.
