Ms. Alexander understands that diversity of thought and diversity of interactions does not only exist within the classroom through academic freedom, but must extend to allowing for diverse thought within participatory governance, leadership meetings, classified professional development, and the overall campus culture.

Ms. Alexander also brings a wealth of fiscal management, bond management, and strategic management knowledge. More importantly, she understands how all of these skills have to be integrated into student programming and enrollment management to net the best results for students. She also acts as the chair of the Emergency Response Team at her current college which has single handedly led the college and the students through the COVID-19 pandemic.
