

# Enrollment and Capture Rates of Sweetwater Union High School District (SUHSD) Graduates

2024-25





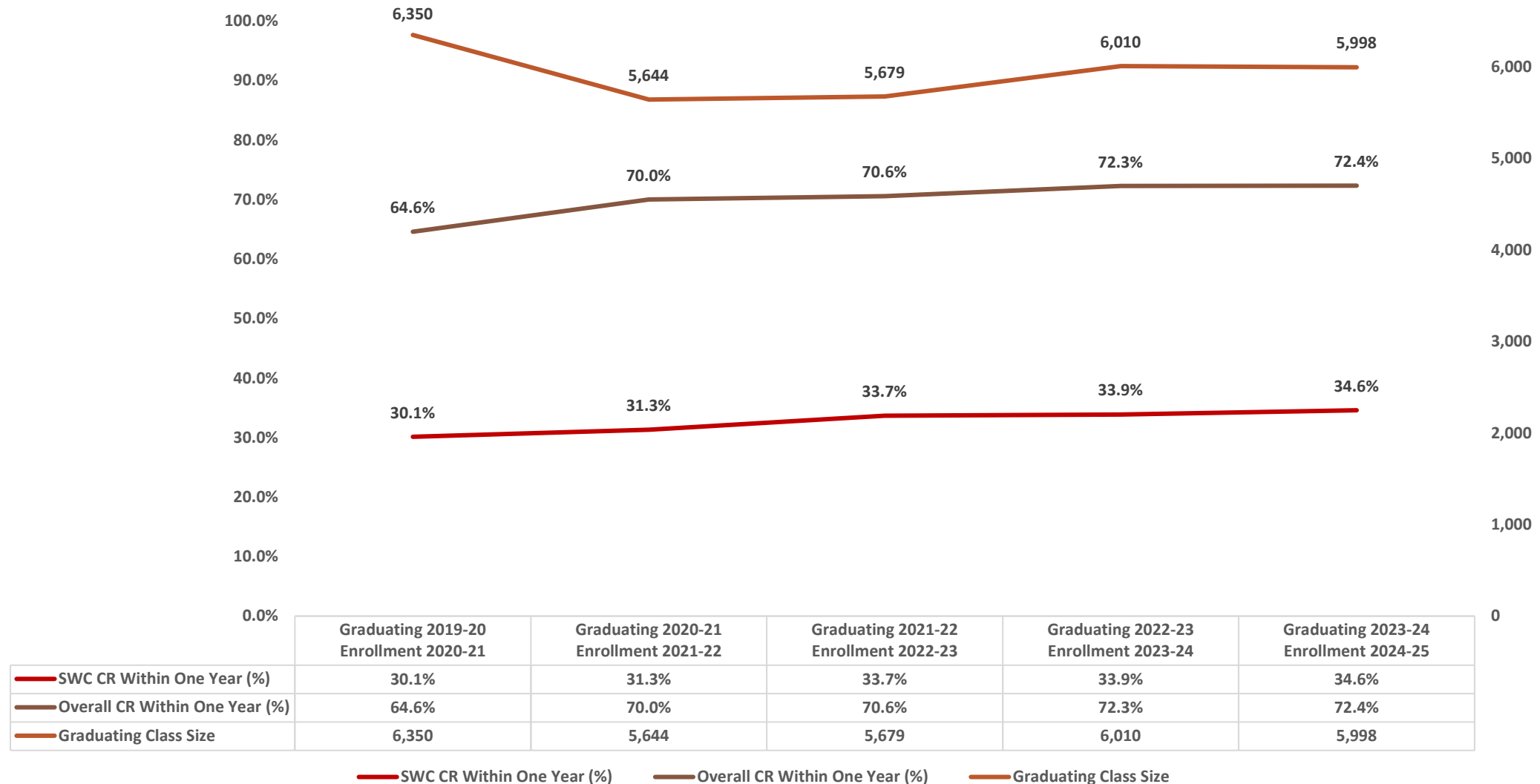
## Definitions

---

- **Capture Rate:** Percentage of students in the high school graduating class that enroll in a post-secondary institution in the year following their high school graduation.
- **Graduation Cohort:** High school graduates with a graduation date between August 16th of a particular calendar year through August 15th of the following calendar year.
- **Post-Secondary Enrollment Period:** Members of the graduation cohort must be found enrolled in a post-secondary institution between May 1st and April 30th following the date of their high school graduation.
- **There is a One Year Lag between the Graduation Cohort and the Enrollment Period:** For the graduation cohort of 2023-24, we review how many enrolled in a post-secondary institution in 2024-25

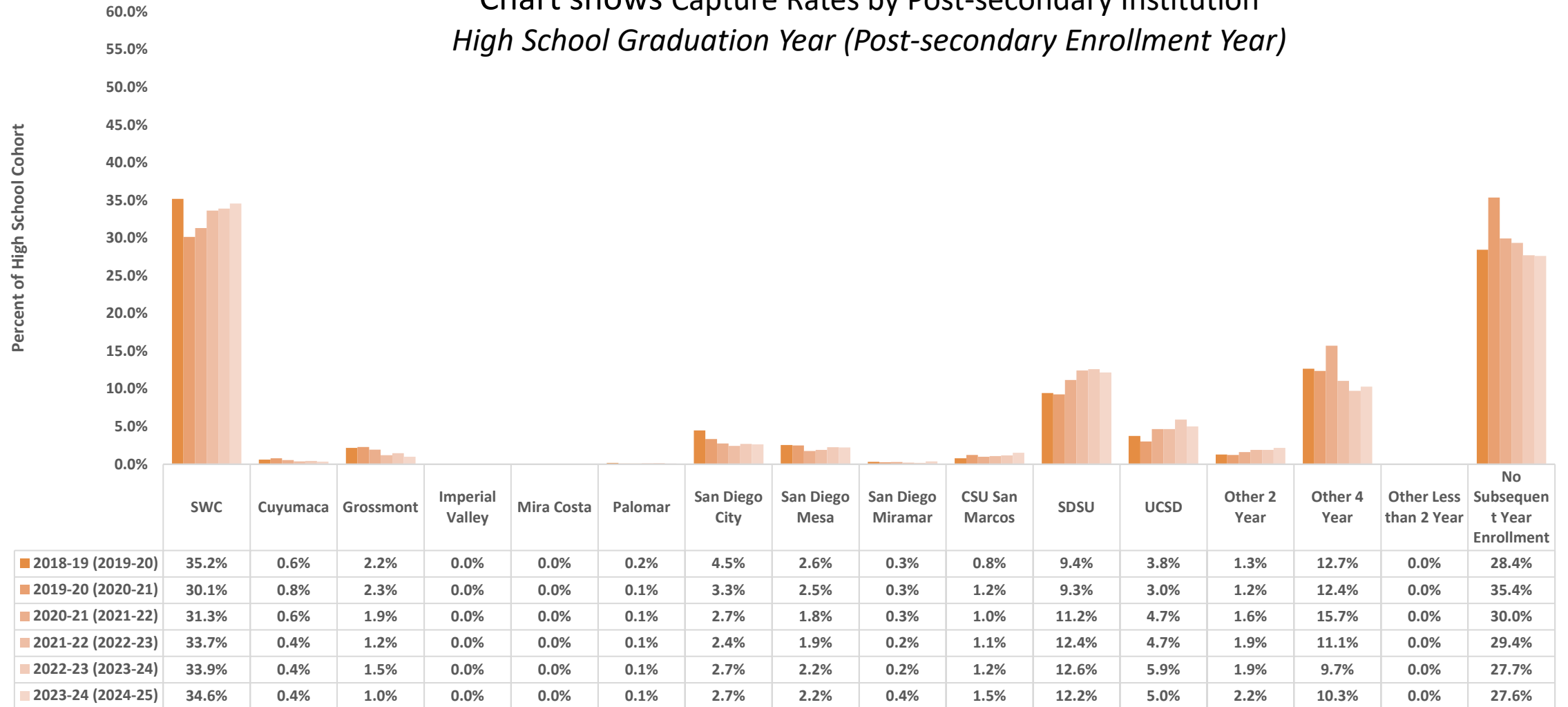
# SWC One-Year Capture Rate of SUHSD Graduating Class

One year capture rate increased slightly to 34.6% for 2023-24 graduates



# Where do SUHSD students go after graduation?

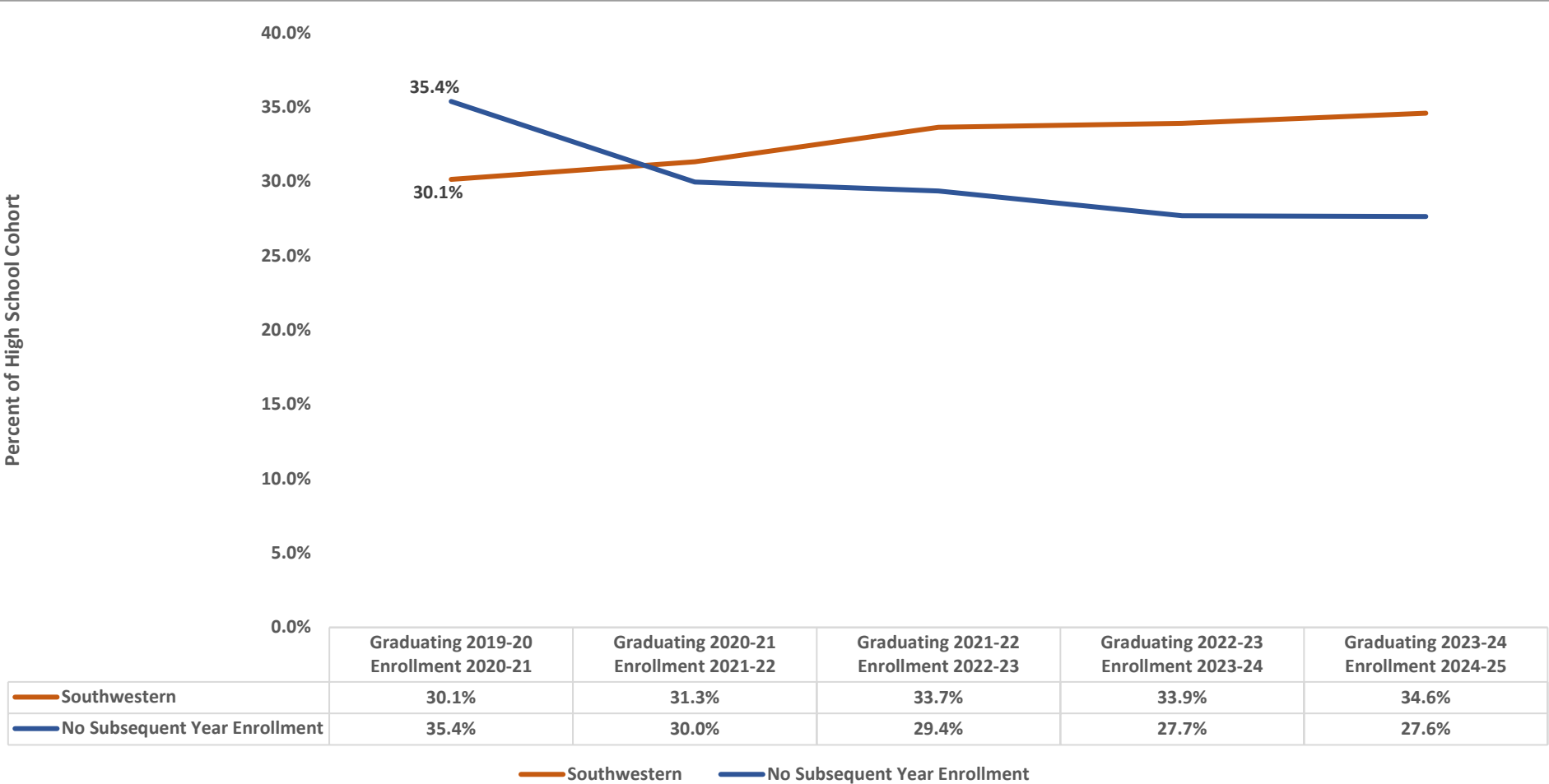
Chart shows Capture Rates by Post-secondary Institution  
*High School Graduation Year (Post-secondary Enrollment Year)*



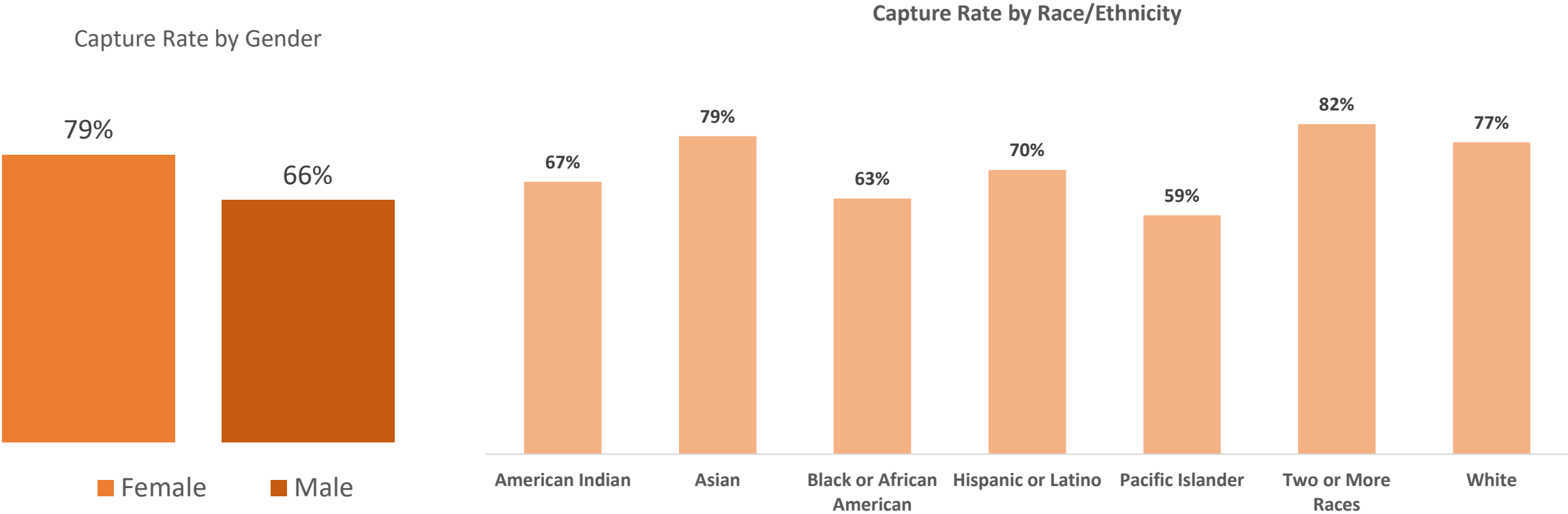
# SUHSD Graduates Enrolling at SWC Compared to No Subsequent Year Post-Secondary Enrollment

SWC one-year capture rate appears inversely related to rate of graduates not enrolling in post-secondary

*Continued increase of SUHSD Graduates enrolling in Southwestern within one year after graduation since 2019-20*

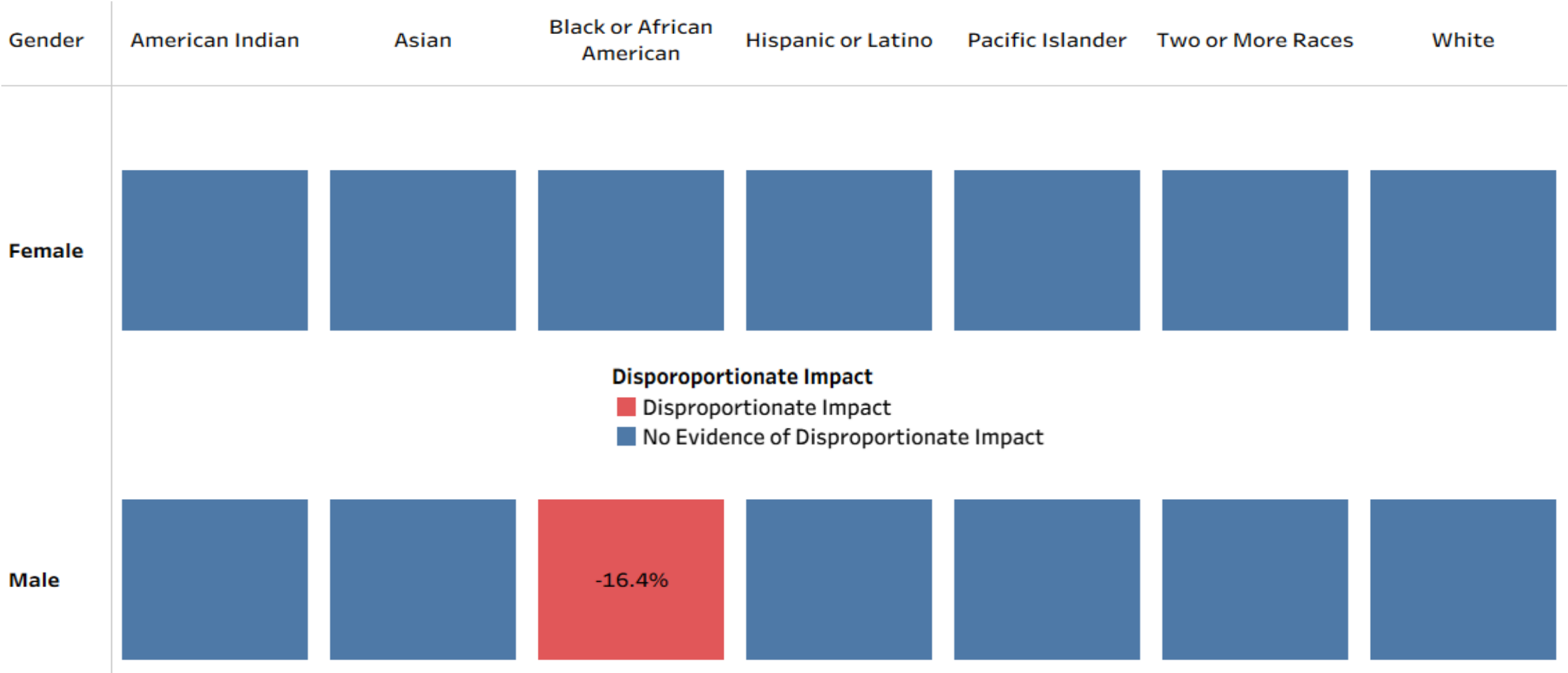


# Capture Rates by Gender and Race/Ethnicity for the Graduating Class of 2023-24



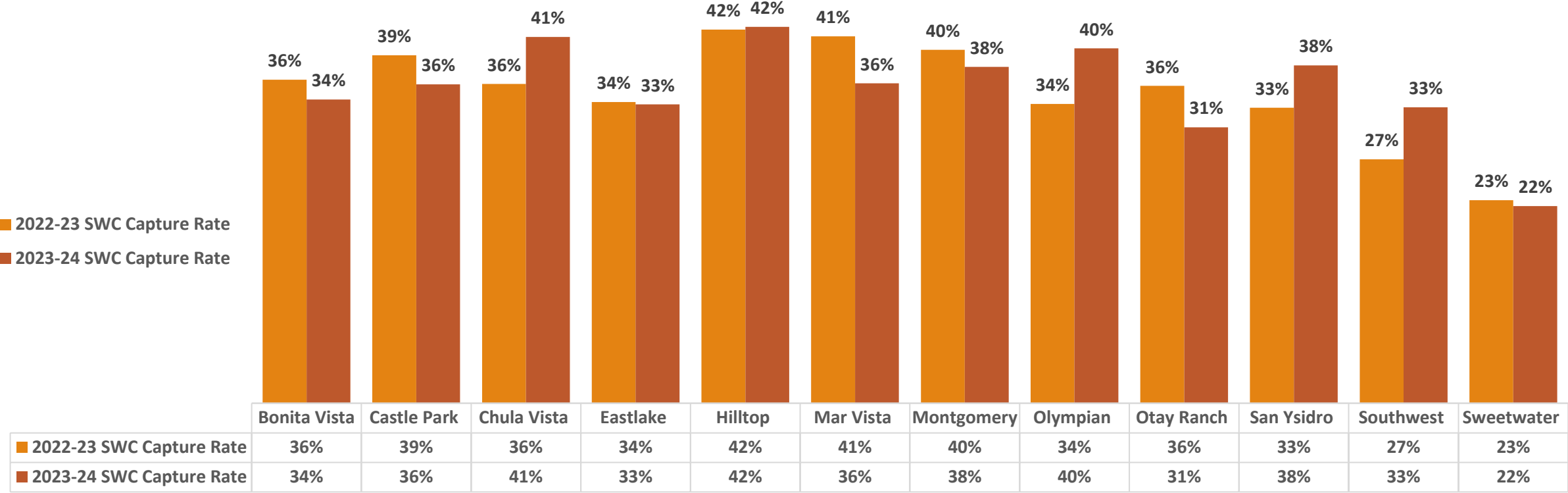
# Disproportionate Impact in Post-Secondary Enrollment for 2022-23 SUHSD Graduating Class

Only Black or African American males showed lower post-secondary enrollment rates in higher education than females of the same ethnicity



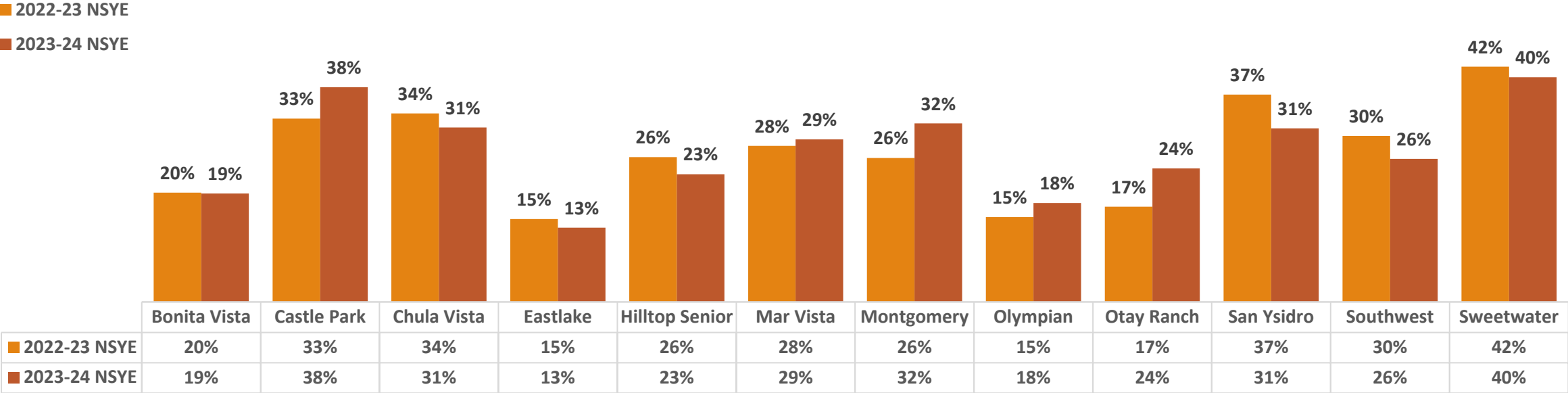
Note: The higher the percentage reported for Disproportionate Impact, the greater the impact on that subgroup.

For SUHSD Medium to Large High Schools of 200+ Students

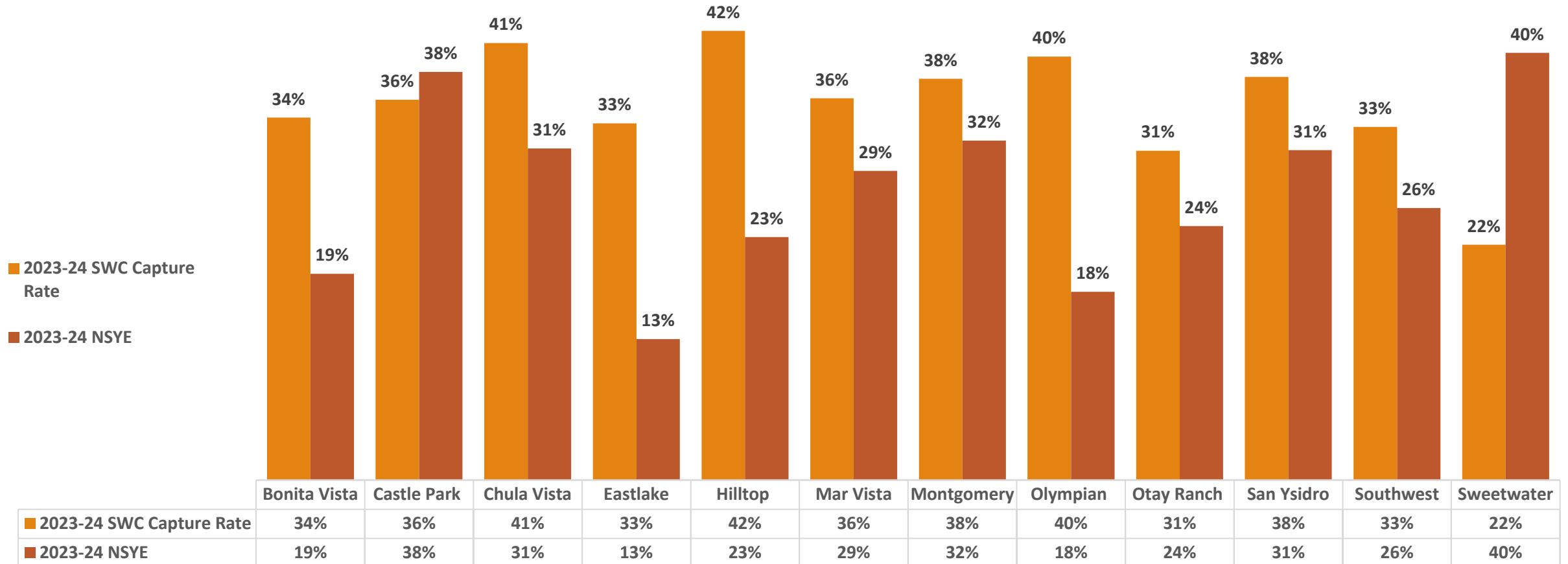




Comparison of No Post-secondary Enrollment by High School Over the Last Two Years

## Key Takeaways

- SWC capture rate of SUHSD graduating class has increased each year since 2019-20 and reached 34.6% for the 2023-24 graduating class (who enrolled in SWC in 2024-25)
- Percent of graduates not enrolling in post-secondary within one year following graduation decreased for the 2023-24 graduating class, but still is 27.6% which represents an opportunity for SWC
- Best SWC opportunities are with high schools which have a higher number of students, lower SWC capture rate, and higher rate that do not attend post-secondary (e.g., Sweetwater and Castle Park)
- Capture rates disproportionately lower for Black or African American males
