No. 4100 AP GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES

8. "Double-counting" Courses for Program Requirements -

While a course might be approved by the Curriculum Committee to fulfill more than one general education requirement, it may not be counted more than once for these purposes per title 5 section 55062; however, a course may be used to satisfy a general education requirement, a course requirement in the area of emphasis, and the Lifelong Learning and Wellness graduation requirement if applicable. Additional limitations on double-counting within a program must be approved by the Curriculum Committee. Regardless of how a student "double counts" a single course, the student must complete 60 units of coursework to be eligible to petition for a degree. ~~A student may only double count courses beyond the 18 units minimum required for the program, except Associate Degrees for Transfer.~~
