8. "Double-counting" Courses for Program Requirements -

While a course might be approved by the Curriculum Committee to fulfill more than one general education requirement, it may not be counted more than once for these purposes per title 5 section 55062; however, a course may be used to satisfy a general education requirement, a course requirement in the area of emphasis, and the Lifelong Learning and Wellness graduation requirement if applicable. Additional limitations on double-counting within a program must be approved by the Curriculum Committee. Regardless of how a student "double counts" a single course, the student must complete 60 units of coursework to be eligible to petition for a degree. A student may only double count courses beyond the 18 units minimum required for the program, except Associate Degrees for Transfer.

CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT CAREER/TECHNICAL (MAJOR CODE: CBE01)

Designed to prepare students to diagnose, service, repair, and adjust Brake, Suspension, and steering systems on passenger vehicles and light duty trucks. All instruction meets or exceeds ASE (Automotive Service Excellence) standards. Program completion will prepare students for employment in local and national chains specializing in "under car" service.
