



SOUTHWESTERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE POLICE DEPARTMENT AB 481 MILITARY EQUIPMENT COMPLIANCE INVENTORY

1. SUMMARY

Assembly Bill 481 (AB 481) requires law enforcement agencies to obtain approval from their governing body prior to acquiring or using military equipment, as defined in California Government Code § 7070.

The Southwestern Community College Police Department (SWCPD) operates under the authority of the Southwestern College Governing Board.
