IT Data Center >>>

Community college members and proud construction workers cut the ribbon on the new IT Data Center on September 20, 2022. The building is approximately 16,100 square feet and includes offices, classrooms, data center, network spaces and IT spaces. Solar panels are being installed in 2023.

Project Budget: \$25.6 million Project Status: Complete



Institutional Technology

The building was occupied on August 12, 2022 and the college celebrated with a ribbon-cutting ceremony on September 20, 2022. The building is approximately 16,100 square feet and includes offices, classrooms, data center, network and informational technology spaces. The building has a net zero environmental effect with the exception of the server room.

Project Budget: \$24,929,505

Project Status: Completed July 22, 2022



Operations and Warehouse Relocation

This project consists of four phases; during phase 1 and 2 all contract work has been completed. This part of the project consisted of the completion of the Grounds building and infrastructure of phases 3 and 4. Phases 3 and 4 will consolidate Facilities, Operation and Maintenance into one location and relocate the warehouse. Phases 3 and 4 are pending to be bid.

Project Budget: \$41,628,567 Project Status: Increment 1 & 2 Completed December 9, 2022; Increment 3 and 4: TBD



<<< Instructional Complex One

The district broke ground on November 9, 2022 and will house a range of teaching and learning spaces and lecture classrooms with more than 113,801 square feet. A new state-of-the-art planetarium will be part of the new instructional complex and the building will share its space with a University Center. Here, four-year universities can offer bachelor's degree programs for South County residents. The grading and underground utility work is complete. Building foundations and slab on grade have all been completed and 70% of the tilt-up panels have been completed and erected in place.

Student Union Complex

center stage at the February 27, 2023 groundbreaking for the new Student Union. It will house a new cafeteria, bookstore and office spaces for the Veterans' Resource Center, Learning Communities, and the SWC Cares Hub (Jag Kitchen Food Pantry and Cares Closet). Also included is space for Personal Wellness, the Culinary Arts program, meeting spaces for the ASO and a ballroom. The existing buildings have all been demolished allowing for construction of the new student union building. To date, all underground utilities, and building foundations have been completed as well as all building floor levels. Framing of the first and second floor interior and exterior walls is in progress and as well as rough in of the fire sprinkler mains, mechanical, electrical and plumbing trades.

Landscape & Nursery Technology >>>

Classrooms and support space are under construction to house the LNT program in the Southwestern College Botanical Garden. Students will learn about design, construction, maintenance, nursery production and all landscape-related professions. Support facilities include a greenhouse.

The new building structures and greenhouses are 100% complete and the interior finishes are in progress. Site grading for the new hardscape and bio-retention ponds continue and the new site concrete walls are being formed and poured.

Project Budget: \$42,321,769

Projected Status: Projected Completion July 21, 2024









Baseball & >>> Softball Facilities Upgrades

Significant improvements were made to our baseball and softball facilities. A new expanded press box now accommodates coaches, press, and announcers, enhancing the game experience. A much-needed restroom building was constructed at the softball field, ensuring player and spectator comfort. Accessible paths from parking areas were also established. Additionally, new fire hydrants and a fire main were installed near each site, improving safety measures. Furthermore, new sewer and water lines were provided to the baseball site for potential future expansions. These enhancements contribute to the overall improvement of our facilities and the experience for all involved.

Tennis Court Relocation

A substantial development is underway for our tennis facilities, as we embark on the construction of an expansive tennis center in Parking Lot G. This new center will feature a centralized championship court equipped with spectator seating, offering an elevated viewing experience for tournaments and events. Alongside, we'll introduce 10 modern tennis courts, setting the stage for high-quality play. The addition of a clubhouse will provide essential amenities, including accessible restrooms, sports medicine spaces, a coach's office, and a team room. Furthermore, this clubhouse will serve as a hub for after-school student programs, fostering community engagement and athletic development. Upgraded lighting will extend the usability of the facilities into the evening, enabling broader community access and enhancing the overall experience for players and spectators alike.

Project Budget: \$13,418,752

Project Status: Projected Completion June 20, 2024




Performance >>> and Financial Audits

The independent auditing firm of Eide Bailly, LLC conducted the district's annual audit. The auditor's opinion notes that the district's financial statements, including Propositions R and Z, properly present the financial position and remaining fund information as of June 30, 2022. In a report provided to the Governing Board, the auditors provided assurances that the district properly complies with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) and Federal and State regulations.

About Propositions R and Z

Proposition R is the \$389 million general obligation bond approved by voters in 2008. Proposition Z is the \$400 million general obligation bond approved by voters in 2016. A total of \$482.2 million from both bond measures has been spent. Proceeds have constructed new facilities that have greatly enhanced the educational and community experiences available to the residents of South County. Academic buildings have been constructed at the Chula Vista, National City and Otay Mesa campuses. New community buildings, such as the Performing Arts Center and the Wellness and Aquatics Complex, offer all residents an opportunity to connect with the college.
