# SALLY RIDE SCIENCE

# SAT PREP BOOT CAMP

#### **ENROLLMENT**

Each course has a minimum and a maximum enrollment, depending on the course. Courses not meeting the minimum enrollment may be cancelled. In the event that a course is cancelled, you will be notified in advance with the option to switch your student to a new course or be refunded the full cost of the cancelled course.

#### **REFUNDS AND TRANSFERS**

Refund requests may be considered when meeting the following deadlines:

**June Courses:** May 8, 2020 to receive a full refund, less \$25. From May 9-May 22, a refund can be granted at 50% the cost of the course. After May 22, no refunds are provided.

July Courses: June 5, 2020 to receive a full refund, less \$25. From June 6-June 22, a refund can

be granted at 50% the cost of the course. After June 22, no refunds are provided.

SAT Prep Boot Camp - June Course: May 8, 2020 to receive a full refund, less \$25.

**SAT Prep Boot Camp - July Course:** June 5, 2020 to receive a full refund, less \$25.

No refunds for SAT Prep Boot Camp will be provided after the above dates.

**Transfers:** Transfers are allowed if requested more than 3 weeks prior to the start of the student's course. No transfers are available when requested less than 3 weeks prior to the start of the student's course.

**3D Modeling & Animation in Autodesk Maya:** Get ready to navigate in 3D space! Learn the tips and tricks the professionals at Pixar use to create, color, and animate using Autodesk Maya software. Work to build an object and make it move, from a cool start to an accomplished finish. Release your creativity in the class that is all about imagination and technique! This course is suited for both beginners and returning students, as new approaches and techniques will be taught. \*Students need to bring their own USB Drive to class each day.

**American Sign Language:** Do you want to learn a new language, using your hands? Through games, exercises, discussions, and activities, you will learn the alphabet, numbers, colors, family signs, and more – all in American Sign Language (ASL)! Along the way, you will also learn more about Deaf culture, including some of the misconceptions. By the end of this course, you will feel confident about sharing what you have learned with others!

Concept art is involved in all designs, such as character design, monsters, fashion design, storyboards, cars, and more – the choice is yours to illustrate!

**Courtroom Experience:** What better way to learn about the court system than to act it out? Get your chance to be a judge, witness, bailiff, juror, or clerk, as you participate in mock trials while learning about the justice system. Experience criminal and civil trials, along with alternative dispute resolution. This is your chance to experience what it is really like inside a courtroom!

**Create your Own Dream Home:** Get inspired and discover how to make your dream home come to life! Using 3D modeling and rendering software, you will use your imagination to create your own unique dream home! Explore digital model making, and learn more about three-dimensional architectural modeling. Crime Scene Investigation I (CSI I): Become a Crime Scene Investigator this summer! Learn the basic components of crime scene investigation as you learn how evidence such as fingerprints, shoe prints, and DNA is collected. Examine why evidence is allowable in court and how having a specific process for collecting items is important. Case studies, fingerprint rolling, and evidence collection practice...this course is perfect for any inspired Investigator! \*Students interested in continuing their CSI journey can also sign-up for CSI II, where new techniques and concepts will be introduced.

At the end of the course, prepare and present your scientific evidence and conclusions to the class! \*This course is recommended for students who have completed CSI I or CSI in a previous College for Kids year, but it is not a requirement. **Earth: Gateway to Planets:** As we approach a time when the possibility of finding life outside Earth is in the next few decades, we search to understand the Systems that make life possible on those other worlds. Plate tectonics, volcanism, atmosphere circulation, and overturning of the oceans all play a critical role in supplying nutrients, and maintaining habitats on Earth and potentially elsewhere. Through hands-on activities and a review of the latest research, you will embark on a quest to explore how these systems may play out on Europa, Mars, Enceladus, and Titan, culminating in the development of a predictive alien life in our solar system.

**Film and Video Editing:** Do you ever wonder how movies and videos are pieced together? It's the Editors! Become an editor for the week as you use Adobe Premiere to edit a 1-3 minute travel highlight video. Learn how to cut and trim footage, create transitions and effects, and add music and more using one of the best editing softwares around. Add a new skill this summer by learning how to edit! \*Students need to bring their own 5GB USB Drive to class each day.

**Filmmaking:** Go behind the scenes or in front of the camera to create a commercial or movie trailer! Participate in roles such as directing, camera operating, sound recording, art directing, lighting, voice-over, and of course, acting and improvising! Create a commercial during the week of June 15-18, or create a movie trailer during the weeks of June 22-25 or July 6-9. \*No experience is necessary. This course will take place both inside the classroom and outside (for filming).

**Focus on Photography:** Building off a foundation of photography history, this interactive course will cover camera basics, composition, exposure, lighting, photoshoots, portrait and action photography, photojournalism, editing, creating a portfolio, and more. Whether you are looking to capture memories, explore a future career, or just boost your Instagram feed, this course will give you the tools and experience to increase your confidence as a photographer! \*This course requires that students bring their own photo device to class each day – bring your Point and Shoot Camera, DSLR Camera, or even your phone! **Hip Hop Dance:** Learn beats, rhythm, dance routines, and musicality in the class that is like a never-ending dance party! You will be taught various styles of hip hop techniques, and have an opportunity to create your own choreography to showcase to family and friends. Learn how to dance to all different types of music – from new school to old school. This exciting dance class will leave you feeling confident about dancing hip hop!

Inside the Mind: Do you ever wonder why we think the way we do?
Go inside the mind as you learn all about cognitive psychology and the theories involving perception, attention, memory, language, and problem solving. Through case studies and hands-on activities, you will be able to apply research experiments to understand human mental processes and their role in thinking, feeling, and behaving. This is an excellent course for those who want to pursue Psychology in their future, or are just curious and want to learn more about it!

The Magical World of Harry Potter: Discovering Hidden Themes: Calling all Muggles! Do you love Harry Potter and wish you could attend Hogwarts School of Wizardry? If so, this course is for you! Together, we will analyze themes, motifs, and images from the illustrated versions and films, as well as consider the different opinions people have about Harry Potter books. **Maker Lab:** Design is all around us, and this course is an opportunity to explore and experience the building blocks of design! In the 4th-9th grade class, design things such as egg drop devices and soda bottle rockets that actually launch! In the 7th-9th grade class, build bridges, towers, geodesic domes, and more. **\*This course takes place at the highly acclaimed ARTS facility in National City (200 E 12th St. National City, CA 91950).**

**Microsoft Word for Kids:** Whether you are preparing to write reports in school, or have an interest in writing stories on your computer, this course is for you! **Pottery: Creating with Clay:** Our acclaimed Pottery class is back for another summer! This popular course features traditional techniques used in ceramics to make glazed pottery. **\*This is a 2-week, 2-hour course (10 am - 12 pm or 1-3 pm).** All works will be fired by the instructor.

By the end of the course, you will know how to create & control a fully functioning rigged character!

**Digital Treasure Hunting: Geocaching 101:** In a world of Pokemon Go! and escape room adventures, everyone loves a puzzle...especially when there's a prize! Using handheld GPS units and some creativity, students will learn different types of geocaches, how to fund one, and how to create their own for others to find. **Intro to Circuits Using Makey Makey:** Do electronics and food go together? In this course, they do! 
